Instructor's corner

Ear equalizing

During your "breifing" remind your students to equalize their ears every 6 inches or 15 cm.

In case of difficulty to equalize, remind the student not to go back up, to stay on the descent rope and to try all the ear equalizing techniques he/she has learned ; valsalva, gulp, to move the jaw and the massage behind the ear. After one minute, go back up 1foot or 30cm and try the exercise again.

During the descent, by taking place in front of the student and by making the gestures, he/she will imitate you.

Be patient! Certain students can require up to three minutes to balance their ears during the first dives.
